³ Tomas is still alive and living in the city of Colón in Matanzas province. He is son of Honma Sakuya (deceased) mentioned in the list's last page. His brother José was the only Cuban nikkei professional baseball player, who also played in the United States and Mexico under the name of "Joe Nakamura" (using her mother's maiden name, because in Spanish Honma would have to be pronounced as "Onma"). The members of Tsukimi Kai delegation visited both brothers and know about their experiences.
